

# Design Professionals Roundtable Recap: Artificial Intelligence: Risk, Responsibility, and Best Practices for Design Firms

On April 28, 2026, MG+M The Law Firm hosted a Design Professionals Roundtable on the evolving use of artificial intelligence (AI) in architecture and engineering practice.

The panel discussed AI's growing role in design workflows—from modeling and drafting to research and data analysis—and how its use intersects with the professional standard of care, contractual obligations, confidentiality and ethical considerations. The discussion also highlighted key risks and opportunities, offering practical guidance for firms looking to integrate AI responsibly while managing liability exposure.

- + **Clear internal policies and consistent practices are critical**, including guidance on appropriate use, review processes, and documentation.
- + **Documentation will be increasingly important** in demonstrating how AI tools are used and supporting defensible project decisions.
- + **Firms must balance innovation with risk management**, taking a thoughtful approach to integrating AI while managing potential liability exposure.
