Plaintiff aggressively pursued our client with numerous sets of discovery, but due to responses eventually agreed to a voluntary dismissal. There were limited defendants related to cosmetic talc and posed significant risk in a dangerous jurisdiction.
- + Obtained summary judgment for a cosmetic manufacturer in a Los Angeles talc litigation case alleging asbestos

contamination in makeup and body powder products; the court sustained all evidentiary objections and granted the motion.
